



Outstanding Arrest Warrant Protocol for Safe Stations

If it is determined during the intake process for the Anne Arundel County Safe Stations program that the individual seeking treatment has an outstanding arrest warrant in Anne Arundel County the following protocol is in place to further assist the individual's placement in treatment. For those with non-violent offenses it may be possible for the warrant to be quashed and a new trial date scheduled.

Warrants

There are three (3) types of warrants issued. Those with Direct Deposit warrants must be taken into custody. It is not possible to quash these warrants. Those with Failure To Appear (FTA) and/or Arrest warrants may be quashed depending on the charge. The SAO has determined that some crimes will not be considered for this program and individuals found to have outstanding warrants in this (NO) category should be taken into custody immediately. Any offenses marked as domestic violence will not be considered. The offenses outlined in the second (YES) category qualify to be quashed.
