Opioid Rx/methamphetamine

- Rural and isolated—primary drug trafficking route
- Lacking treatment facilities
- Third highest overdose rate in Arizona (behind Phoenix and Tucson)
- Dr. Ye Case and Dr. Khan Case
- Remaining
 - Three largest opioid prescribing doctors in the state (200,000 population)
 - One doctor exceeds the entire VA hospital in Phoenix, Arizona
 - Cartel case—pending grand jury

- Aim to improve population health outcomes through collaboration, assessments, improvement planning, and policy and program development




