

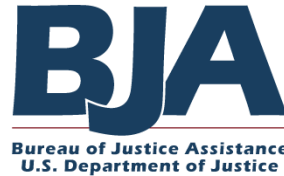

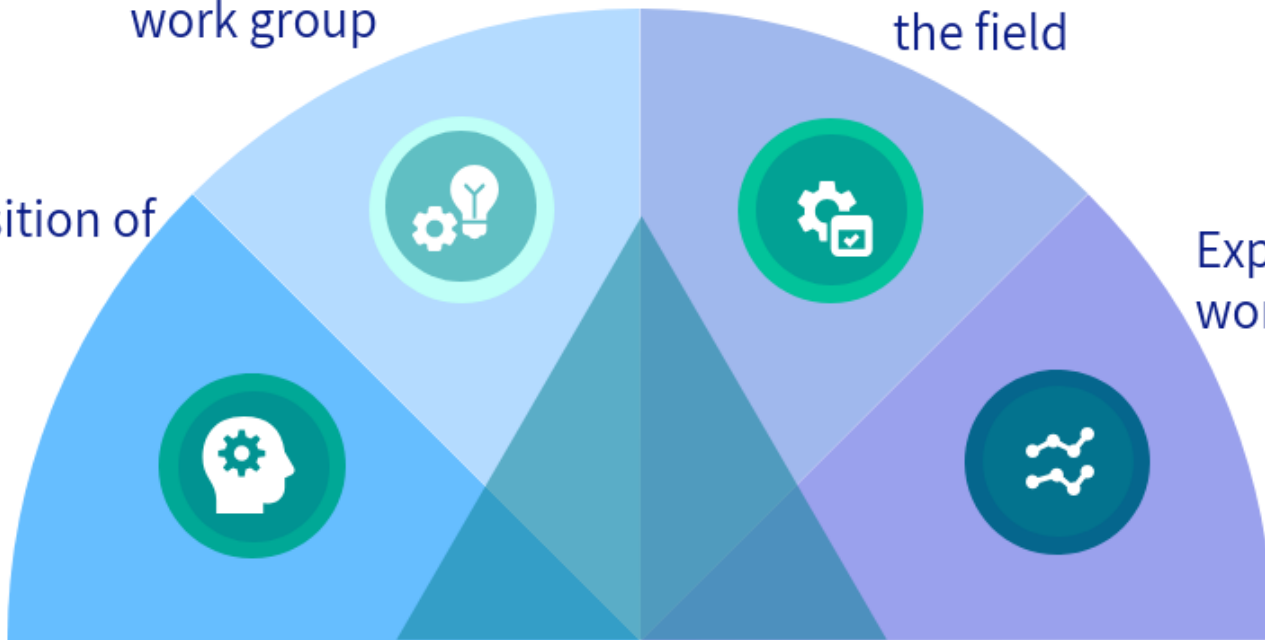


Continue multidisciplinary work group

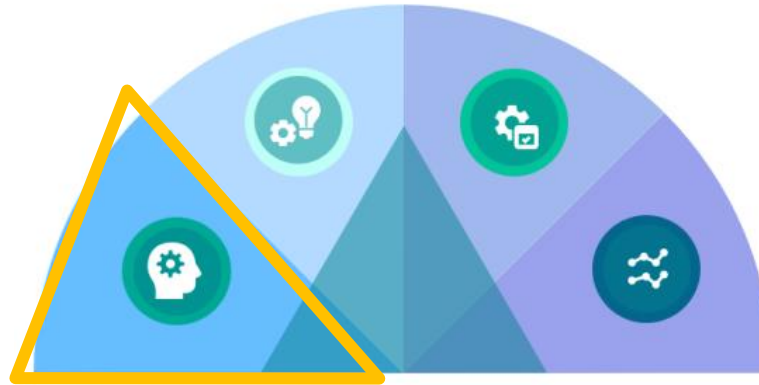

Accomplishments

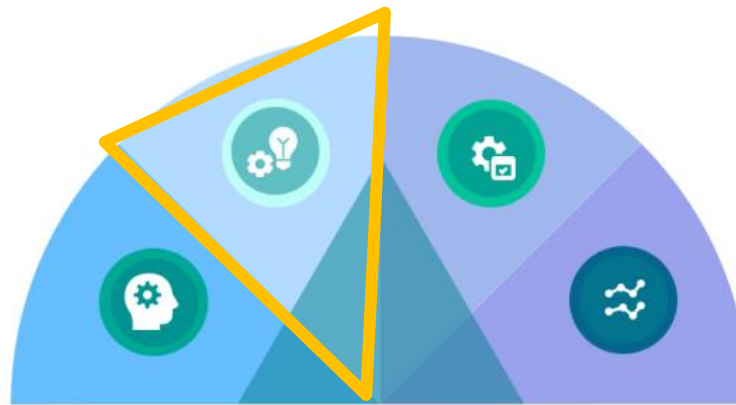
- ORCO established

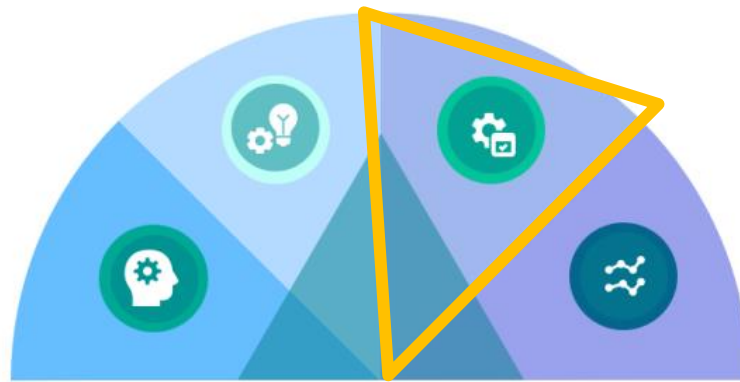
- Momentum from BJA Harold 'Hal' Rogers grant activities
